'Who's in the loo? There's a very long queue. Is it an elephant doing a poo?'

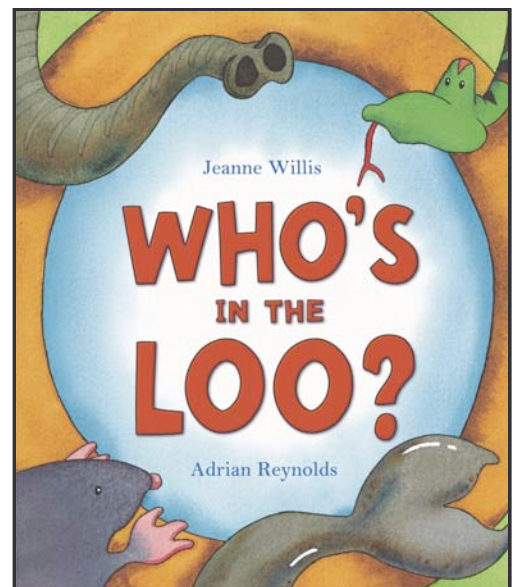

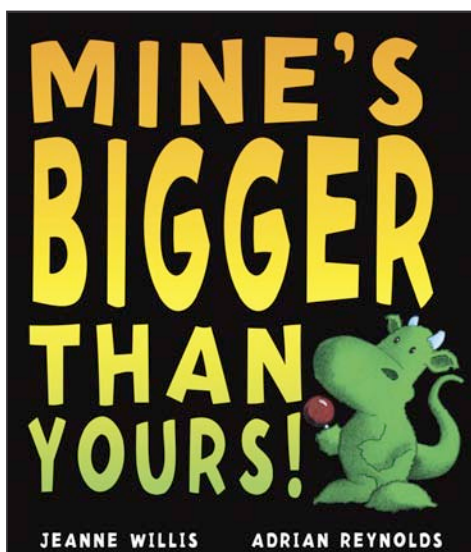
Mine's Bigger Than Yours! (2008), written by Jeanne Willis

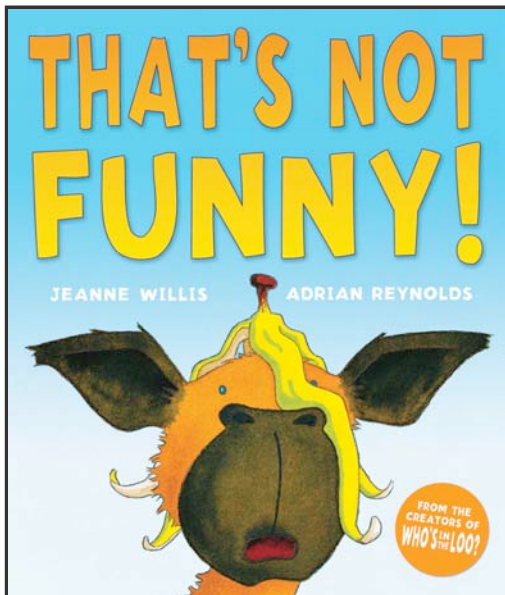
A monster of a follow-up to the award-winning *Who's In the Loo?*

I'm Sure I Saw A Dinosaur (2011), written by Jeanne Willis

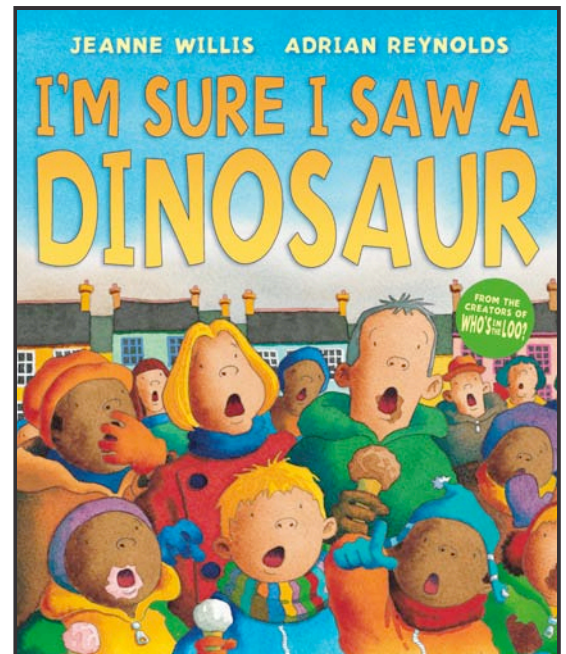
An irresistible seaside romp!
